



the stories of others.







## How Serving at Family Promise Made a Difference for Me....

Recently, our church hosted 3 families (10 people) from the Family Promise program. I signed up to cook a meal and deliver it, ready to eat, to Room 004, where two other persons who had signed up to be Hosts, would take over the serving of it and share dinner and friendly conversation with the families there. Room 004, the room where we usually meet for Adult Sunday School and Thursday Bible Study, had been "brightened up" with colorful tablecloths.

Room 004, the room where we usually meet for Adult Sunday School and Thursday Bible Our guests from Family Promise arrived around 6:15 p.m.; some of them looked tired, and all of them looked hungry! They seemed "shy" and quiet, at first, but our Hosts for the evening, one a member of YUMC and the other, from a partner church, greeted them warmly, which helped them to relax, and by the time we sat down together, we were all more relaxed and talking together. The guests seemed to enjoy the dinner and the conversation with us; they even went back for second helpings. One of the mothers asked me to hold her 12-month old baby while she finished her second helping of dinner. I considered that a sign of trust.... and an honor ....since she didn't know me until an hour before. By 8:15 p.m., both families had gone upstairs to their bedrooms; they had to be ready for pickup back to the Family Promise Day Center by 5:00 a.m!

Meeting these families who were currently homeless but were making the effort to gain the knowledge and skills needed to be self-sufficient was a humbling experience.

We lead very different lives, the Family Promise guests and me. I've never been homeless, and rarely

"inconvenienced" by the lack of what I physically need for a safe and healthy life. Cooking a meal as my contribution to our church's effort to participate in the Family Promise program turned out to be much more than just "cooking a meal;" it became an opportunity to touch the lives of people who need a helping hand, at the moment, and an opportunity to respond to that need, as Christ taught us to do.

Family Promise families will return to YUMC for another week in November.



Every effort is made by YUMC volunteers to make the Sunday School classrooms feel "homey" for the Family Promise guests.


#### 60 Year Anniversary in this building is on the Horizon: A Brief History


On Sunday, November 24, 2019, we will celebrate 60 years of worship and fellowship in our church building. As we look back on our notable history, we give thanks for the ways that God has used our church to serve God and God's people in Yardley and beyond. God's not finished with us yet, and we look forward to our future with hope and excitement. Our history reflects a church that has welcomed all persons to wor-

ship, supported their growth in our Christian faith, and encouraged the expression of that faith through word and action.

The earliest written record of our history lists a baptism in 1834. By 1835, Methodists were meeting at an old storehouse on Bridge Street, now Afton Avenue, near the Delaware Canal. The growing congregation built a brick church in 1838 on South Main Street -- the current site of the Yardley Town Center. The church would join a 9-church 'charge' to which a pastor was assigned. The "charge" grew and divided several times, until in 1952, Yardley Methodist Church, with 301 members, became a separate pastoral charge. After enlarging its building twice, in 1955, the congregation purchased  $3\frac{1}{2}$  acres of land just outside Yardley Borough at Scammell's Corner in Lower Makefield, the site on which the present church stands. It was completed in 1959, and the first worship service was held in the new building on November 22, 1959. It was soon joined by a parsonage in 1962 and later enlarged by an Education Wing and Office Suite in 1991.

In the tradition of United Methodism, our church has ministered to the surrounding community and to the world in ways that authentically reflect the Good News of Jesus Christ. It took a stand for civil rights in our community during the turbulent 1960s. In the early 1970s members established an after-school chil-





An active childrens' ministry at YUMC includes Sunday School, a singing troupe, Wednesday evening God Squad (supper, singing, recreation and fellowship), special activities for 4<sup>th</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> graders, and a summer Vacation Bible School, open to all children in the community.

There's a strong emphasis on nurturing youth in growing as Christian disciples at YUMC. A full-time youth leader and dedicated parents and adult volunteers guide and support youth as they study and discuss together, and plan and carry out fund-raising events to help pay for mission trips in the summer – a Goods and Services Auction, Chili Cook-off, the Pumpkin Patch and Pumpkin Palooza - events that provide fun and fellowship for all in the congregation. In 2014, three senior high youth felt "called" to provide a mission trip experience for middle schoolers, so they founded My-Calling!, a five-day mission experience, housed at the church, that welcomes youth and their leaders from other congregations, twice a year.

We are blessed with exceptionally capable and caring staff members: a Senior Pastor, who in 2017 was granted a Lilly Endowment Clergy Renewal Grant and who helped prepare this congregation and fellow staff members to function during her 4-month absence; an Office Manager, who manages the daily responsibilities of the church office and is the chief communicator to the congregation; a beloved Youth Director, who plans and resources the youth ministry program, and loves and supports each one of her students; the Director of Music, who plans music for both services to mesh with the emphasis of that day, then performs it, on organ and piano, with bells and voice. These staff members, except for the Pastor, have all served at YUMC for between 16-20 years. A Nursery Caregiver cares for our infants and toddlers each Sunday, while our Sexton cleans and prepares our building for the week's activity.



The church also hosts and engages in programs promoting interfaith dialogue, peace and social justice issues. Interested members attend events sponsored by The Peace Center in Langhorne, PA and POWER Bucks, newly-organized, grass-roots organization dedicated to finding solutions to issues of social injustice in Bucks County.

Our church building is a vital partner in the church's ministry. It serves as our meeting place for worshipping God, for educating and nurturing our members and attenders in the Christian faith, for housing ministries like Family Promise and MyCalling!, and for providing a welcoming, well-maintained, and safe meeting environment for community programs: several 12-step programs, Boy Scout Troop 10, and others.

The church's passion for service has taken it well beyond its Yardley home. Annual intergenerational mission trips have served those in need in inner cities and underserved areas of our country, on Native American reservations, and in areas of our country recovering from disaster in Maine, West Virginia, the Gulf Coast, Mexico, Washington, D.C., South Dakota, and the coastal areas of New Jersey and New York. The Life Giving Water Project, begun in 2002 by church members at YUMC, has grown to include other congregations and individuals around the U.S., and, to date, has funded the drilling of over 100 deep water wells that provide accessible clean water for people, crops, and livestock in villages in Zambia in southern Africa.

The future of Yardley United Methodist Church will be written by an inclusive and mission-minded community of Christians that continually looks for different and better ways to serve its neighbors, near and far, in Christ's name.
