# On Monday, September 20, 2021, the Administrative Council of YUMC voted to approve notification procedures for possible exposure to Covid 19.

If you have tested positive for Covid 19 and have been in our church building at least a week prior to testing positive, please contact Pastor Marcia at 215-499-3351 or Nancy in the church office at 215-493-3345 to let us know.

#### Your medical information will be kept private.

This notification will be sent to only those individuals who could have been exposed.

Our contact tracing includes maintaining attendance records of who is in worship each and every Sunday.

#### [Sample] Notification of Possible Exposure

Our church has been notified that an individual who was present at our church on [MM/DD/YYYY] has tested positive for COVID-19. From our records, we are separately notifying everyone we know who may have had close contact with the individual that day about the possibility of exposure. If you experience symptoms of COVID-19, such as fever, chills, cough, difficulty breathing, new loss of taste or smell, or other symptoms, please contact your healthcare provider about COVID-19 testing. If you do test positive, please contact Pastor Marcia or Nancy in the church office, so the church can determine if any other people need to be contacted. As always, YUMC will protect all personal medical information and not use the names of those who have tested positive.

#### Covid 19 Policy and Procedures for Yardley UMC 9/20/2021

#### **Objective:**

To define the Policies and Procedures that YUMC will use during the Covid 19 Pandemic to keep staff, church members and visitors safe.

#### Policy:

Concerning Covid 19 policies, YUMC will abide by the recommendations expressed by the United Methodist Church Eastern Pennsylvania Conference and will take into account the recommendations from the CDC and the Pennsylvania Health Department. Any significant changes to these policies will be brought up to the Administrative Council and decided by a majority vote.

#### **Procedures and Preventative Measures:**

- 1. The building must undergo routine cleaning by a cleaning service or a sexton, who's responsibilities are provided in a job description.
- 2. When and if masks are mandated by our governing bodies, then we will move to comply. We do still suggest that church service attendees be social distanced from those not in their "family or bubble" group.
  - 3. Masks will be made available for those who have forgotten theirs.
  - 4. Hand sanitizers will be provided in the church pews and at the church entrances.
- 5. Attendees of church services will fill out the blue cards provided in the bulletin with their names and date of attendance. This will be used as a confirmation of attendance in case someone in attendance is confirmed to have Covid 19, and they will be kept for at least 3 months.
- 6. If someone does have a positive test for Covid 19, it should be reported immediately to the Pastor, who will initiate the Notification Process to those attendees that have possibly come in close contact with that person. The name of the person who has tested positive will not be released to the general public.
- 7. Individual Communion packets will be used for Communion and offering plates will not be passed, but will be available at the church exits. Giving online or by mail will be promoted.
  - 8. Speakers will use their individual microphones and they will be properly cleaned after the service.
- 9. If masks are mandated by our governing bodies, they can be removed by speakers and choir members if they stay at least 6 feet from others.

- 10. Signs must be posted at the church entrances concerning any mask or social distancing policies.
- 11. If someone is not feeling well, they should be encouraged to stay home and attend worship online.
- 12. When and if masks are mandated by our governing bodies, any outside groups and church groups using classrooms or the Fellowship Hall should wear masks when entering the building. When seated and socially distanced, they can remove their masks.
- 13. Outside groups should be asked to take attendance at every meeting for contact-tracing purposes and keep the attendance sheets for at least 3 months.

#### **Notification Procedures:**

(See notification procedures at the beginning of this article)

Contract tracing of the individual should go back a minimum of one week before the test showed positive results.

The area/s where the person visited should be cleaned thoroughly, using disinfecting wipes for all surfaces, and the area should remain unused for 4 days, to ensure any potential virus has been eliminated.

#### **Questions:**

Any questions concerning these procedures should be addressed to the church staff.

#### **Updates:**

Updates to this policy will be made as needed, and approved by the Administrative Council.



The Food Drive Continues: No Purple Bags, but yes to food donations for Penndel Food Pantry. In September, through your generosity, a total of 151 pounds of food was delivered to a grateful Penndel Food Pantry. Since 2016, YUMC has delivered 14,432 pounds of food to the food pantry. So do not worry about purple bags or when to drop the food off, just bring it with you any time and place it in the shopping cart in the lobby of the church. (If the church is not open when you bring your donations, you may leave them at the top of the ramp.)

Parents, Friends and church members are welcome to join this once in a lifetime experience! **Sign up early, to participate in the fundraisers.** 


