## A Reflection on Sharing ....

Summer's practically over.... and the major events of YUMC's summertime activity, MyCalling! and the Senior High-Adult Mission Trip to Milwaukee, Wisconsin are now satisfying memories to be savored and an impetus to continue praising and serving God by responding to the needs of others. At the Mission Trip Celebration on August 11 in Fellowship Hall, we saw pictures and heard both youth and adult participants talk about their experiences there. (Look for related articles on our Missioner' reflections elsewhere on this and the next page.) The missioners are aware that when they go into communities to serve others, they are there on behalf of all of us back here at YUMC.

Our youth program is strong in spirit and purpose. It has loyal parental and lay support, and it's leadership is caring, committed, and focused on living out Jesus's message of loving God by loving and serving others in need. Our youth program serves as a model for the rest of us to be engaged in reaching out to others in helpful and loving ways.

Meanwhile, "back in the 'hood," congregation members are also serving others in a variety of ways, both within the church and beyond its walls. From within, members and attenders, guided and supported by our staff persons, volunteer to serve on committees that direct our day-to-day program of ministry, provide refreshments for our weekly Fellowship Coffees, cook meals for the programs MyCalling!, Family Promise, and Grace Café in Philadelphia, volunteer as Prayer Partners to support our Mission Trip participants with daily prayers and gift bags, make monthly donations to local food pantries, serve food and tutor students in preparation for their high school equivalency exam at a soup kitchen, buy gift cards for clothing and school supplies for children in transitional housing, participate in interfaith and Peace Center gatherings, and other programs that YUMC either creates or promotes. A member planted the beautiful summer flowers by the entrance ramp for all of us to enjoy each week. Others participate in a bi-monthly Work Day to keep our church building, grounds and parsonage repaired and well-maintained.

Still others at YUMC feel personally "called" to share their skills, time, possessions, and financial resources beyond the community of the church family, within the larger community. Two persons from YUMC volunteer at United Methodist camps for one or two weeks each summer, one, as a camp nurse, the other, as a counsellor. Another works at a local organic farm, helping to weed, plant and harvest crops and promote the concept of sustainable farming. Someone volunteers to repair and maintain used medical equipment (wheelchairs, walkers, etc.) for loan to disabled persons. Members volunteer at AHTN (Advocates for Homeless and Those In Need) to help operate the Code Blue program that provides overnight shelter for homeless persons on extremely cold nights. A member, a military veteran, volunteers with an organization whose mission is to keep World War II veterans socially "connected". He writes their monthly newsletter and researches military records of veterans, when requested by family members. Then, there are those who represent the church by serving as Executive Board members and volunteers in local non-profit organizations.

Our building is a mission partner, too. It's a valuable asset that we share with the local community by providing a meeting space and kitchen facilities for several



# Reflection on the Milwaukee Mission Trip

We selected Milwaukee because it is a mission site with a different focus. While most trips are 80% construction, 20% relational, Milwaukee was 60% relational, 40% construction.

We were split into two crews. The first crew worked on building a fence for a family in the morning and in the afternoon organized sports activities for the kids of the community.

The other crew worked in the morning with the Salvation Army making 1700 sandwiches for kids. In the afternoon they continued their work with the Salvation Army by leading a VBS for kids in different neighborhoods.

The week gave us all the ability to step out of the comfort of our own lives and to learn from others. One thing we all were amazed at is the amount of people in need in Milwaukee. We also were amazed at the people serving year round in Milwaukee.

I am thankful that we had this opportunity to work at an inner city Mission trip.

In the weeks, months and years to come, I am excited to see the impact this one week has on the team as individuals and on our community.

We can not thank the church enough for taking this journey with us and helping us experience this very different mission experience!

# MyCalling! 2019 at Yardley UMC

July 14-18th MyCalling! was held with 81 youth and adult leaders at Yardley UMC along with 32 volunteers serving as Site Directors and in the Kitchen, giving us 113 involved...but wait! There's more! Another 63 people served through My-Calling! at Morrisville UMC for a grand total of 176 at MyCalling! Missions 2019!

While the numbers are fun to share, the real story is in the ministry, which is twofold:

- 1) Service The MyCalling! Mission Trip of Yardley provided the opportunity for middle schoolers to experience a variety of missions and impact the following people and organizations in our community: Anchor House, Furniture Bank, Camp Mercer Kids Camp, Holmesburg UMC, Penndel Pantry, the Maker's Place, Snipes Farm & Education Center, Statesman Health & Rehab, White Pine Farm, and the home of a YUMC family member. Our crews worked hard and learned they are not too young to make a difference and to put God's Word in action.
- 2) Student Leadership 36 high school students participated in training that ran from Friday night to Sunday afternoon in preparation for My-Calling! They learned to lead crews, lead Worship, and to work as true Servant Leaders. The team was made up of youth from 4 different churches in 3 different states, many of whom first encountered MyCalling! as middle school participants. During worship it was shared how they have grown to love missions and have shifted their life focus because of their time at YUMC's MyCalling!

We give thanks to God for another safe and successful summer at MyCalling! We can't wait to see what He has in store for this growing ministry! God is Good! All the Time!
