Pastor Cyndi and David moved out of the parsonage to their new home in Mt. Airy, Philadelphia on June 12, and she is technically on vacation until June 30. If necessary, she will be available for emergencies and tying up loose ends with church leaders and committees. After July 1, all church matters and requests for care need to be directed to Pastor Barb Seekford. This is official United Methodist policy for all departing clergy. In our itinerant system, with regular pastoral changes, this allows the new pastor and congregation to build relationships with each other, and permits the departing pastor to focus on her next field of ministry. It's a challenge for the pastor and the congregation. We separate with sadness, but also with respect for the process.

There's not enough time to say it all. In fact, it would take me five <u>more</u> years to tell you about how much I've enjoyed and appreciated every day of the <u>past</u> five years being your pastor at Yardley. I know that our quick call-and-response at the beginning of every service is probably so familiar that you don't notice it anymore... "This is the day that the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it!" But rote gets real when we do it enough. Even on my days in the church that were hard or sad, and there weren't many- I could almost always find some reason to be grateful, some glimpse of God working in and through us, and I could rejoice and be glad in it; rejoice and be glad in you and in the shared work we did in Jesus' name.

You have been supportive of me from the very first day, when a flock of pink flamingos magically appeared on my lawn, as they did again last night. You have said "Yes" to helping or serving on committees much more often than "No".

You have supported David and me personally and professionally. You celebrated the 25th anniversary of my ordination with me, encouraged my sabbatical and celebrated the Lilly Grant we all received, walked alongside us as we cared for Dave's mom, helped us graduate Stefan and Ryan and see them launched in Brooklyn and Oakland, and welcomed my parents' RV and my whole extended family who came for Christmases and Easters and Thanksgivings to stay in the parsonage and to worship, even singing in the choir!

You have supported my ministry at YUMC as we worked together to follow God's call. And God has been with us as a church while we struggled and while we celebrated, visioned and planned; played, prayed and sang. We taught children, youth and adults, supported missions and comforted the elderly. We wrestled with some of the bigger questions facing all United Methodists, which are still unresolved, and we navigated a social and political situation that still divides our country. And yet, in spite of any differences, we found common ground-we even found unity-in our bond as faithful followers of Jesus Christ and most especially as a church family. We love and serve God and God's people: that's what Yardley does and what guides us every day.

This pandemic has surely changed the way we do church, but we've seen that the heart of our ministry, while we do need to care for our buildings, is really in the heart of each of us. I will always be grateful for all of you, for your support, your encouragement, your commitment to growing in faith, your constructive criticism when it was needed, your prayers, and surrounding it all, your love, actually...

If there were any parting words (notice I didn't say parting shots!) that I'd share, let me say thank you to everyone who's ever believed in this calling I've had, including my parents, my siblings, my husband Dave and my wonderful sons, Stefan and Ryan, along with all my extended family who've let me be part of family baptisms, weddings and funerals over all these years.

Thank you to every single church member here and at all of the seven churches where I've been, from New York to Germany to California to Pennsylvania. I've loved you all. The only question that remains is: Where do we go from here, all of you, and myself included? It's right there in the scripture. Jesus told us what to do. "Go therefore and make disciples... teach them to obey everything that I have commanded you...love the Lord your God with all your heart and soul and mind and strength. Love your neighbor as yourself. And remember... I am with you always." Amen.

You outdid yourself in giving me an unforgettable farewell, full of wonderful surprises that truly came from your hearts. You have no idea how meaningful it was for me to be surprised by the virtual choir benediction and the laying on of hands!! 
Even as we say We say "Godspeed" to Pastor Cyndi, we say "Welcome" to Pastor Barb.


On July 1, 2020, The Reverend Barbara Seekford, appointed by the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference of the United Methodist Church, will begin as Senior Pastor at YUMC. She will conduct her first worship service at YUMC on July 5th.

Pastor Barb has been a United Methodist pastor for fifteen years. She graduated from Ursinus College with a Bachelor of Arts degree in English and from Eastern Theological Seminary with a Master of Divinity degree. An ordained Elder in the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference, she has served as pastor of both Bustleton and Chalfont United Methodist Churches. As a clergy member of the Conference, she has served on the District Committee of Ministry as well as been both a candidacy and a clergy mentor. She currently serves on the Conference's Congregational Transformation Team.

Pastor Barb has received training and a certificate in Coaching. She states in her bio, "This has been beneficial in my role as pastor as I am able to utilize these skills to help both individuals and churches discern where God is calling them and help them to feel equipped for the journey ahead."

Pastor Barb is originally from Boyertown, PA. She and husband, Andy, have two grown children, Kevin and Stacy, one grandchild,





According to Conference protocol, until July 1, 2020, we are not permitted to contact Pastor Barb about matters related to current or upcoming ministry at YUMC. She is, as is Pastor Cyndi, still fully engaged in ministry with her present congregation. Each congregation and pastor will want to savor those remaining months together, as they remember the experiences they've shared and the range of emotions that the anticipation of saying "Goodbye" brings.

of ministry events – Vacation Bible School, the Local Mission experience for Middle Schoolers, and the distant Youth and Adult Mission Trip.

Over the past 5 years, Pastor Cyndi's gifts of ministry have enriched the life of this congregation and the local community. She has participated fully in all events and activities at YUMC; teaching adult and youth in small group settings, joining mission trips, playing in the handbell choir, and participating on "Work Days" to help maintain the church building and groups. At the parsonage, her love of gardening produced "spectacular results". Her passions for ministry included planning creative worship experiences and children's sermons that entertained and taught Christian truths to children and adults alike. Additionally, she demonstrated her passion for peace, social justice and inclusiveness by her participation in events in the local community that addressed those issues. Her husband, Dave Breen, has been involved in ministries at YUMC, too. He sang with the choir, and attended many of the church's events, when his work as professor and researcher at Drexel University permitted.

At our final online worship service together on June 7th, Pastor Cyndi's parting words to us were:

"What's next, for all of us? Jesus told us where to go and what to do... and promised us, 'I am with you always'."

That Sunday afternoon at 1:00 p.m. we lined up in our cars in the parking lot of the church for a "Drive-By" Farewell, past the parsonage, where Pastor Cyndi and Dave were seated on the lawn, with the parsonage, with its neatly-tended gardens, as a back-drop, and surrounded by lawn signs and flamingos, to receive our final, "in-person" words of appreciation and "Auf Weidersehen"... while social-distancing from our cars.


Cyndi and Lisa:



On June 7, we held up signs of gratitude for Pastor Cyndi.










