





#### Lent at Home

In an effort to help make your observation of Lent meaningful, we've put together a bag materials for you. 

On behalf of the Stewardship and Finance Committees, we would like to thank you all for your generous support through 2020, and your continued support through 2021. Our Stewardship Drive was successful, with pledge totals higher than last year thanks to increased generosity, even though we had a fewer number of people who pledged. Our totals reached \$260,620, and with the help of those that do not officially pledge, we should be able to meet our 2021 budget goals.

Though we were not together in the building for much of the year, that did not stop our Worship, Nurturing or Outreach. Our online Worship continued live via Zoom, and Facebook, including some special music events and a Christmas Eve service. We have Nurtured each other though online Bible Studies, additional email notices, Youth Group activities at the church and online, as well as at home VBS, Advent and Sunday School programs. And thanks to your continued Outreach generosity, we have continued to provide a safe area for a number of selfhelp groups to meet, Angel Tree gift cards, dinners for Family Promise, Food Pantry donations, items for the Trenton Area Soup Kitchen, Shawls/Afghans from the Weavers of Wellness, donations of school supplies to Bucks County Housing Group and held 2 Youth Mission Trips. As you know, none of this would have been possible without your support and our exceptional staff, and thanks to your continued support, we hope to be able to not only continue much of what we have done, but to expand into whatever new ways we can fulfill God's Calling for our church.

As you know, due to the Covid-19 pandemic and because of safety measures, our Music Ministry groups have not been able to meet in person. Singing indoors, even with masks and physically distanced, is still not safe due to the pressurized aerosols that singing produces which can carry particles that then linger in the air and can travel longer distances than the recommended six feet of physical separation.

During last summer months and into the fall our bell choir (see photo) was able to meet, first outdoors and then in the Sanctuary (properly masked and physically distanced), practice, record a few

pieces and even ring at a couple of our fall in-person services. However, when pandemic numbers started to increase again, late in the fall, and we were forced to suspend in-person worship, the group also deemed wise and safer to suspend our in-person activities.

However, in spite of the Covid-19 challenges our music ministry has remained connected through Zoom gatherings, both for worship as well as fellowship, emails, texts, phone calls, etc. Our YUMC Virtual Choir (see photo) has produced several recorded anthems that we have been able to share at worship.

As we look towards the next few weeks and months, I hope and pray things begin to look up and we can start to gradually resume some of our in-person activities while continue doing what we can remotely.

Plans for the upcoming Lent/Holy Week/Easter music include virtual choir anthems for Ash Wednesday, Maundy

Thursday, Palm Sunday and Easter, as well as hopefully bell choir offerings for Palm Sunday and Easter.

As you may have seen on our schedule we are tentatively planning a 9 am outdoor Easter Sunday worship as well as a 11 am Zoom worship. At the outdoor in-person service we will have the opportunity to sing together, masked and physically distanced; I am certainly looking forward to be able to return to that form of worship and prayer through congregational song.

Thank you to all the members of our Music Ministry for their steadfastness and resilience during this challenging times and for being part of a small community within the larger church family. My thanks also to the entire church family for your continued support of our Music Ministry. You are all in my prayers!






